



The event aimed to enhance participants' soft skills, featuring interactive sessions on communication, leadership, and personal development. Dr. S.P.H. Vitharana, a management consultant and lecturer at Trans Assistance Service (TAS), who previously served as a consultant and trainer for USAID, led the workshop. UNVEILING OF LATE HON. MANGALA SAMARAWEERA'S BOOK COLLECTION

On April 22, 2025, the BCIS hosted 'Reading with Mangala' to commemorate the 69th birthday of the late Hon. Mangala Samaraweera. The event celebrated the donation of his personal library, nearly 2,000 books, to four public institutions: the BCIS Library, Colombo Public Library, Jaffna Public Library, and a special donation to Stefan Andre Joachim for his work with LGBTQ and creative youth. Chief guests included Hon. Hanif Yusoof, Governor of the Western Province, and H.E. Madam Chandrika Bandaranaike Kumaratunga, Chairperson of BCIS. The event was held in collaboration with the Samaraweera-Gunewardena family.

Speakers included Dr. Paikiasothy Saravanamuttu and Ms.Chanchala Gunewardena. Α distinguished panel comprising H. E. Madam Chandrika Bandaranaike Kumaratunga former President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka (1994-2005) and Chairperson of BCIS, Mr. Deshal de Mel, Economist, Mr. Stefan Andre Joachim, CEO/Designer, Andre Estefan, Mr. Murad Ismail, Chartered Architect, Ms. Thushara Witharana, Editor, The Leader reflected on Mangala's deep intellectual curiosity, love for the written word, and commitment to democratic values, creativity, and inclusion. 

AUTHOR TALK

Author Talk: 'The Sociologist & Poet – It Takes Two to Tango' was held on 27th May at the BCIS Library.

Dr Sasanka Perera is the Chairman of the Colombo Institute for Human Sciences and a former Professor of Sociology at South Asian University and the University of Colombo. In his talk, he reflected on the intersections of scholarship and creative writing, both through a methodological prism and as a matter of personal interest.


EDUCATION FAIR

They discussed the history of Women's Day, women's movements in Sri Lanka, and the country's commitment to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW). The lecture was attended by school students, teachers, and other invited guests, aiming to inspire and educate attendees on women's rights, leadership, and social change. LAND TENURE IN VILLAGE CEYLON BY PROF. GANANATH OBEYESEKERE

LAND TENURE IN VILLAGE CEYLON



Professor Gananath Obeyesekere (1930–2025) was a renowned Sri Lankan anthropologist whose pioneering research has left an indelible mark on the study of South Asian societies. His work seamlessly intertwined anthropology, history, and philosophy, providing a deep understanding of social and cultural structures. Obeyesekere's research on Sri Lankan history, belief systems, and rural life continues to influence scholars around the world.

Land Tenure in Village Ceylon, first published in 1967 by Cambridge University Press, is an anthropological study of exceptional historical depth. In this work, Professor Obeyesekere provide a detailed analysis of land tenure and the resulting social structure in the Ceylonese village of Madagama. Through meticulous research, Obeyesekere trace the evolution of land holdings and the correlated kinship patterns starting from the establishment of the estate in 1790.



The book explores the traditional agricultural and economic practices of the village, which were significantly impacted by land shortages, leading to multiple divisions of land shares. Additionally, the introduction of British colonial rule, along with the imposition of Roman-Dutch law and the rise of a cash economy, reshaped the village's socio-economic structure. The practices of mortgaging and land speculation became foundational to a new power structure, influenced by feudal norms of land ownership. This transformation led to a radical reorganization of the traditional village system, providing valuable insights into the forces that shaped rural Sri Lanka.

Land Tenure in Village Ceylon is available at the BCIS Library. This essential work is a must-read for students, researchers, and anyone interested in the history, anthropology, and sociology of Sri Lanka. Come and read this valuable book today.
